



At Harkers Island in Currituck County, North Carolina, Clarence Harker took possession of the island in 1733, gradually giving parcels of land to his children and others, and the line of his estate in 1762, Harker began "to convert the island into an estate. He developed the western end of the island as a "plantation" and built a large "mansion" and had a "great" house. 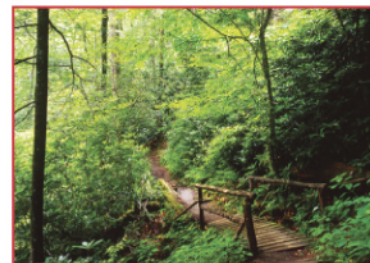

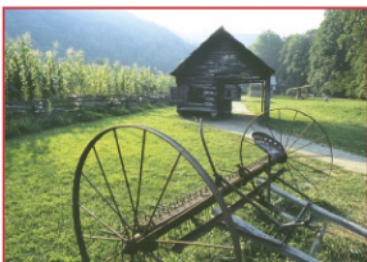

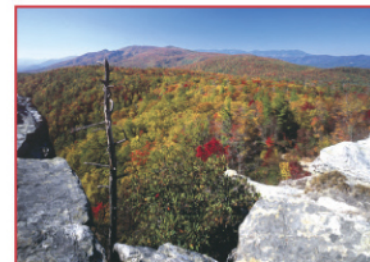
